

2013 CTE Revitalization Grant Review Process

Grant Review Panel

- The Oregon Department of Education (ODE) uses a grant review panel to evaluate applications submitted under this program.
- ODE in collaboration with the Bureau of Labor and Industries (BOLI) will identify a pool of possible reviewers.
- A reviewer cannot participate in the review of a grant where a conflict of interest exists.
- Each grant will be read by a team of at least two reviewers.
- Whenever possible, one reviewer will be from business, industry, or labor and one will be from education.
- The Department of Education will screen and approve grant reviewer applications for direct and indirect conflict of interest. A reviewer cannot review a grant if a conflict of interest exists, including any of the following:
 - A reviewer has agreed to serve as an employee or consultant on a project for which funding is being sought in a CTE Revitalization Grant application currently under review, or has been offered the opportunity to do so and has not yet accepted or declined, based on a grant award outcome.
 - The reviewer's personal financial interests will be affected by the outcome of the competition.
 - The reviewer helped prepare an application in the competition, even if the reviewer has no financial interest in the outcome of that application.
 - The reviewer has a relationship with an entity or individual that has a financial interest in the outcome of the competition.

Grant Review Process

- ODE will provide training and review tools.
- Reviewers will use the review tools to assess how well a grant applicant addresses the CTE Revitalization RFP criteria and submit their final comments and scores to ODE.
- The CTE Revitalization Advisory Committee will make funding recommendations to assure the requirements established in the legislation and budget notes are met.

Awarding Grants

- The Deputy Superintendent of Public Instruction will make the final award decision.
- The Oregon Department of Education will notify both successful and unsuccessful applicants and will provide a summary of comments and suggestions related to their applications.
 - Applicants will have one week from the date of the notification letter to appeal the funding decision to the Deputy Superintendent of Public Instruction.
 - Once appeals have been considered, the award decisions made by the Deputy Superintendent are final.
