Grant Background and General Information



Purpose

Partnerships between business, industry, labor and education is the foundation of CTE Revitalization.

- Strengthen existing or create new CTE programs
- Meet workforce needs while providing students with skills for high wage, high demand careers
- Support high school diploma



Vision and Goals

- Demonstrate innovation in the delivery of CTE
- Show the integration of the separate elements of the proposal into a coherent project
- Support the expansion and growth of CTE
- > Provide students with experiential learning opportunities



Eligibility

School District

- Education Service District
- ➢ Public High School or Middle School
- ➢ Public Charter School
- > Any Combination of the Above



Eligibility – Prior Recipients

Recipients of the previous awards are eligible if:

> New project

Partner in a new collaborative grant project OR

➤ Clear expansion

o documented results

o support for continued sustainability



Award Amounts

➢ Maximum \$500,000

≻No minimum

- If over \$250,000 may be asked to adjust downward in order to fund additional proposals
 - o Do not include plan for adjustment in proposal submission
 - o This does not mean grants under \$250,000 will take priority

Maximum 1 page No point value

Purpose and Scope of Project:

- o Abstract
- o Used for
 - press releases
 - legislative reports
 - publications



Supporting Revitalization Effort (p.9)

Maximum 4 pages 40 point value - total

Explain how the project will support the overall revitalization vision and goals including:

~ Innovation

- ~ Integration
- ~ Expansion and Growth ~ Experiential Learning

Maximum 20 pages 140 point value - total

Outcomes and Progress Markers (p.10)

Point value - 15

Minimum of 5 outcomes and progress markers:

- Sustainable partnerships
- Student access to CTE
- Content rigor
- Career opportunities
- Workforce needs



Outcomes and Progress Markers

> Outcomes can address long term impact.

Outcomes should be measurable, manageable and meaningful.

Progress markers should be short-term measures within the timeline of the grant.



Outcomes and Progress Markers

Examples:

Outcome

As a result of ... students will have more access to CTE in the district as indicated by increased enrollment in multiple CTE courses in the ... program of study.

Progress Marker

Improvement in student attitude and interest in CTE measured by a pre and post survey.



Program of Study Design (p. 10)

Point value - 15

- Expand or develop one or more CTE program or pathway
- Not required to be a state approved CTE Program of Study
- Must include instruction and practice used to address the outcomes



Program of Study Design

Instruction aligned with:

- o state academic content standards
- o industry recognized technical standards
- Students able to demonstrate academic and technical skills
- Clear pathway education continuum
- > High wage and high demand careers



Program of Study Design

May be broader than the grant project
Clarify what the grant will accomplish
Indicate how you will get to the final program of study

> What will be different?



Underserved Students (p. 11)

Point value - 10

> All students succeed academically and technically

➤ Identify specific activities to:

- o Recruit
- o Support



Underserved Students (p. 11)

Includes... but not limited to...

➢ Racial or ethnic minorities

> English language learners

First generation college going Students with disabilities

> Nontraditional by gender

Economically disadvantaged



Oregon Diploma Connections (p. 11)

Point value - 10

> Academic support to meet core academic requirements

- o Credit by proficiency
- o Contextual learning

Career related learning experiences that support Essential Skills

- Support of personalization
 - o Plan and profile
 - o Extended Application



Sustainability and Communication (p. 11)

Point value - 25

How will you sustain:

- Continued maintenance and materials costs?
- Personnel?
- Robust partnerships?
- Student opportunities?



Sustainability and Communication (p. 11)

How will you communicate about the project to:

- Parents?
- Students?
- > Using peer to peer marketing?

How might this be leveraged to assist with sustainability?



Activities and Timeline (p. 11)

Point value - 10

Rationale to clarify connection to outcomes

Complex activities broken down

Clearly leads to completion by June 30, 2015



Evaluation (p. 12)

Point value - 10

Focused on identified outcomes and progress markers

Plan for ongoing evaluation

- o Gives direction to the project
- o Identifies what is working and what is not

Plan to evaluate results

• Did you meet your progress markers?



Partnerships (p. 12)

Point value - 25

> Active partnerships:

o Collaborating, planning, evaluating

o More than only a letter of support

o Financial, time, materials, internships, advice, etc.

Evidence of:

- o Commitment letters from partners
- o Inclusion of partners in activities
- o Matching funds



Partnerships (p. 12)

- > Overall role in development of proposal
- ➢ Role in implementation of project
- > Role in evaluating the project
- > Ongoing role beyond the project
- > Correlation to high wage, high demand careers
- Required commitment letter



Budget Worksheet and Narrative (p. 12)

Point value - 20

> Review what is an allowable expense

Be reasonable on costs

> Make sure all expenses are aligned to grant activities

> Narrative provides detail and shows alignment

> Do not commit grant funds beyond June 20, 2015



Bonus Section - Optional (p. 13)

> Priorities set by legislature or advisory committee

CTE Student Organizations Out of School Time

Middle School

STEM

Regional/State/System Change

Optional to address for additional points

> Must score at least 125 on overview and narrative to be eligible for bonus points.



Career and Technical Student Organizations (p. 13)

Up to 7 bonus points

CTSOs:

Provide exposure to all aspects of industry

> Expand technical and academic knowledge

Develop leadership

How will CTSOs be integrated into the project and support the goals of CTE Revitalization?



Middle School Component (p. 13)

Up to 7 bonus points

Including middle school students:

- > Builds to future learning opportunities
- > Encourages student to persist

How will middle school students be integrated into the project and support the goals of CTE Revitalization?



Out of School Time (OST) (p. 13)

Up to 7 bonus points

Out of school time:

- Any time school is not in session summer, evening, weekends
- > Bolster academic and technical knowledge and skills

How will OST programming be integrated into the project and support the goals of CTE Revitalization?



Regional, Statewide or System Change (p. 10)

Up to 7 bonus points

- Demonstrate scalability of an idea
- Solve a common problem
- Shared resources

What impact will your project have on the regional, state or entire CTE system?





Submission Requirements



	Pleas	e submit the application documentation in the order listed:
	1.	Cover Page ⁶ - Identify each school that will participate in the grant activities. The role of each school must be clearly identified in the grant narrative.
	2.	Required Project Overview – This section may not exceed 5 pages.
Required Submission	3.	Required Grant Narrative – This section may not exceed 20 pages.
p. 7	4.	Budget - This section should include a narrative and budget worksheet. This section may not exceed 4 pages.
	5.	Bonus Narrative – OPTIONAL – Each response to the optional bonus section questions may not exceed one page.
	6.	Previous Recipient Eligibility Response - This section should be completed by previous recipients in order to be eligible for consideration in this grant cycle.
	7.	Required Documentation ⁷ a. Statement of Assurances for Each Participating School b. List of Partners c. Partner Commitment Letters
	8.	Appendix – Any supporting charts, graphs, tables and other materials may be placed in an Appendix and referenced in the Grant or Bonus Narrative.
